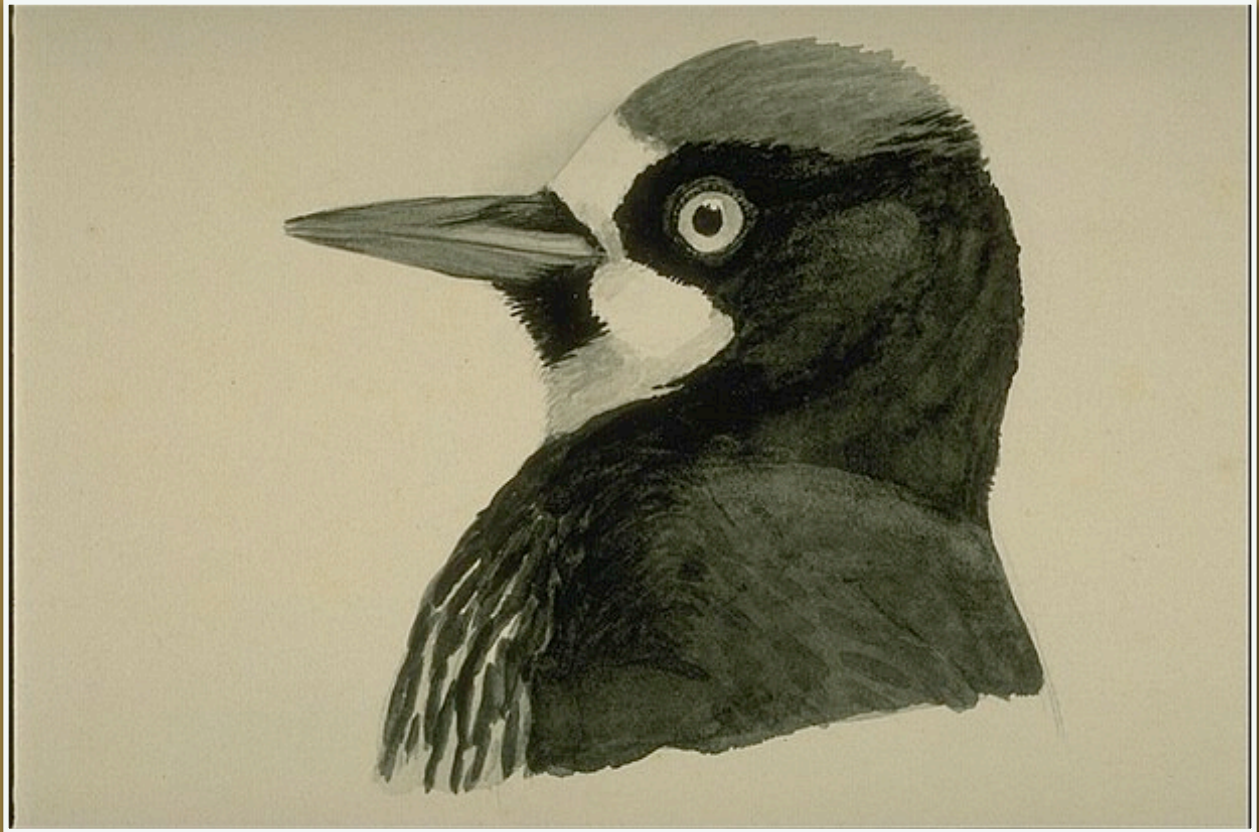

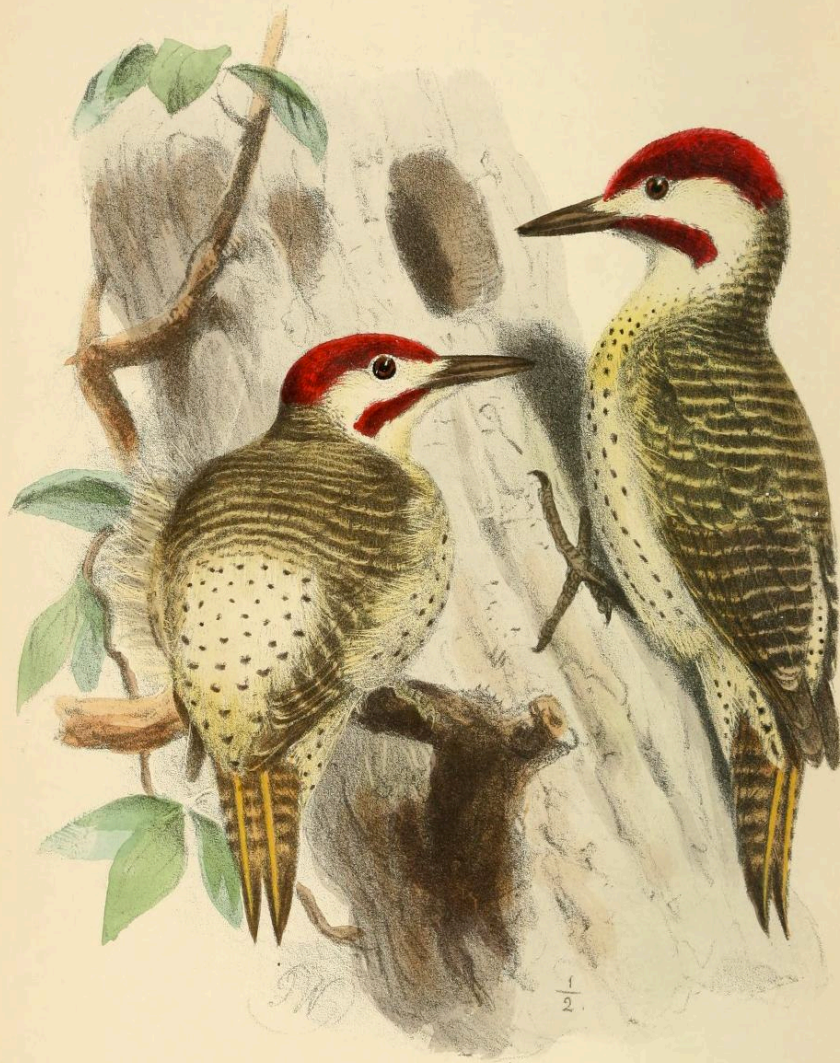

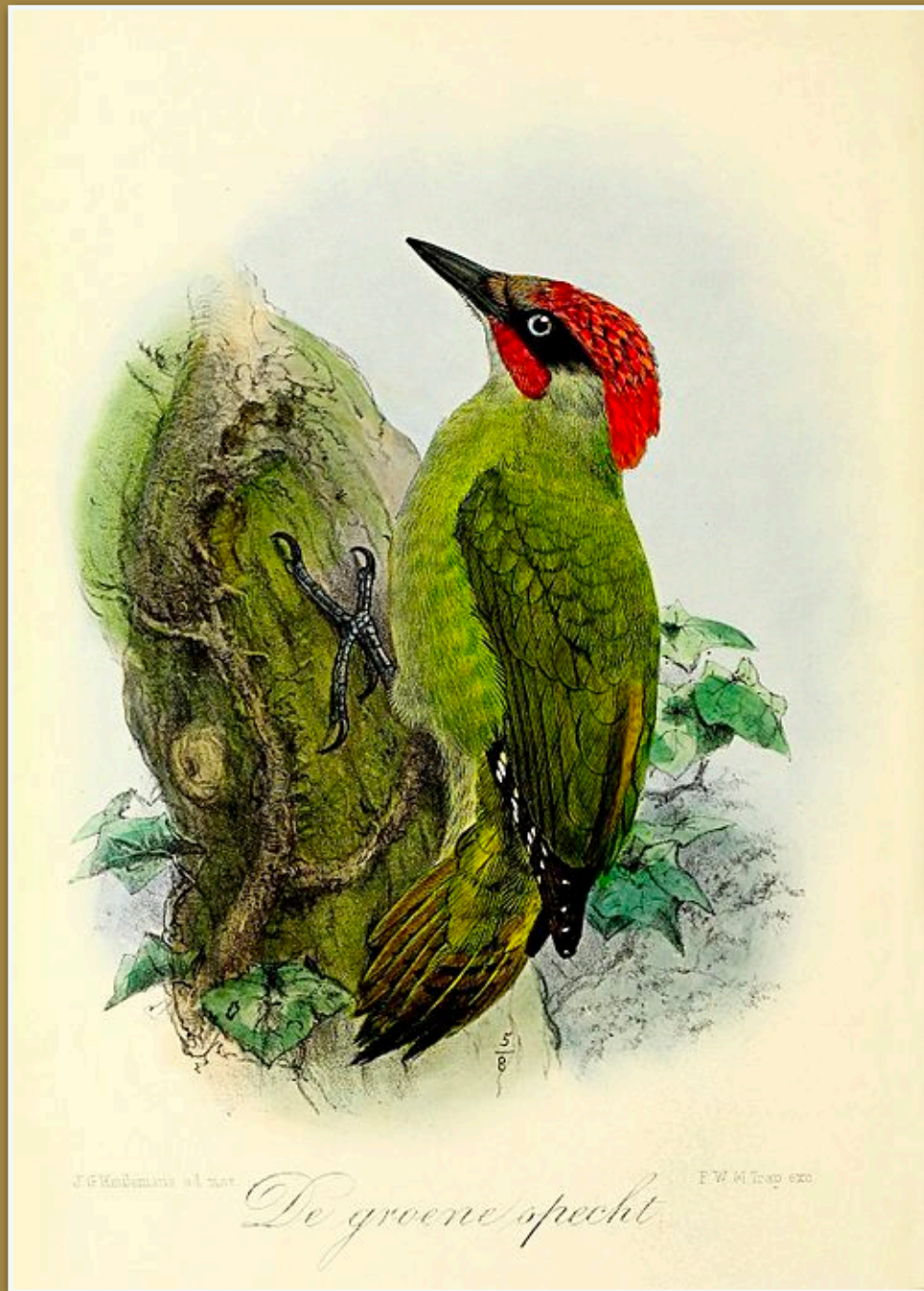

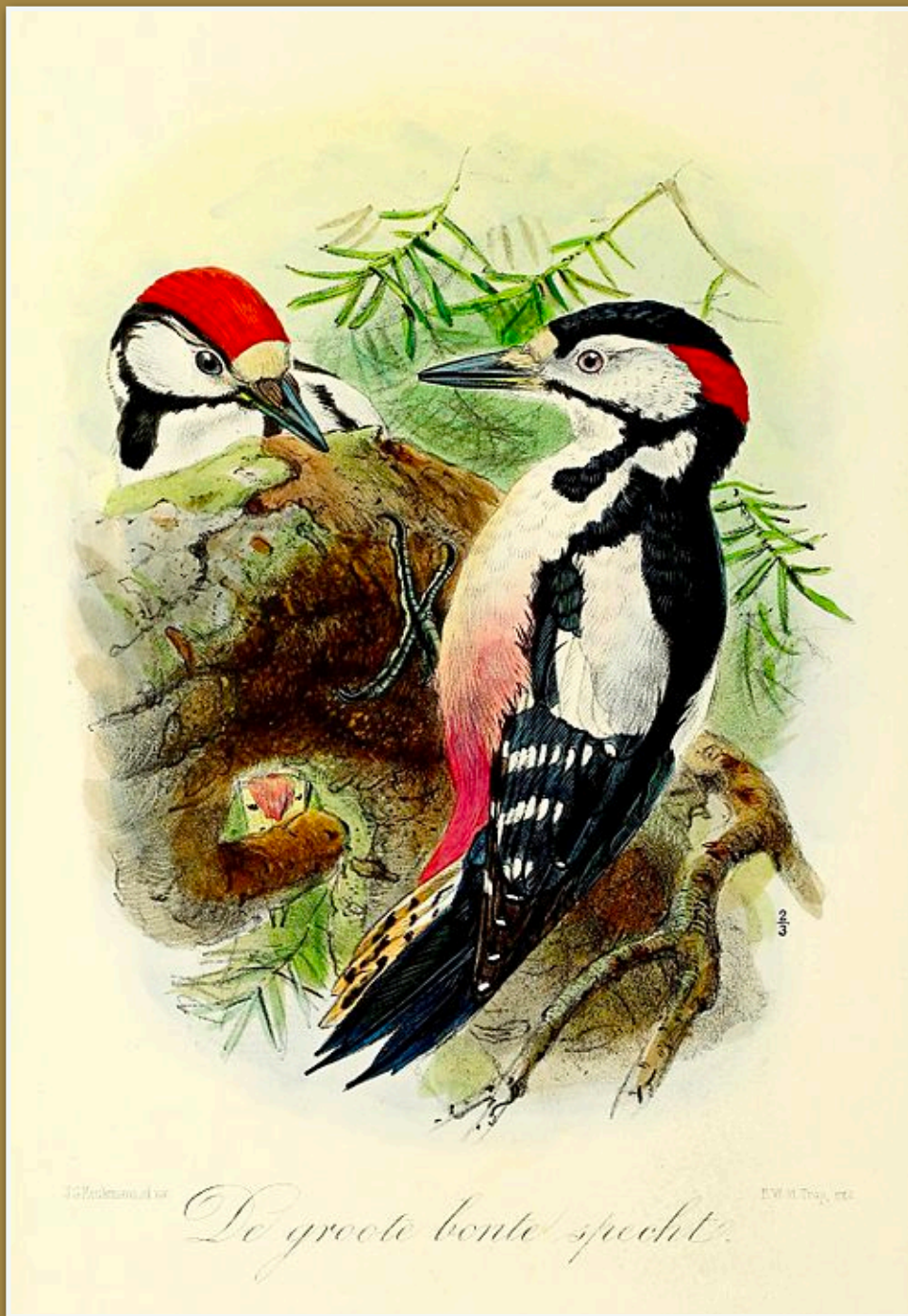

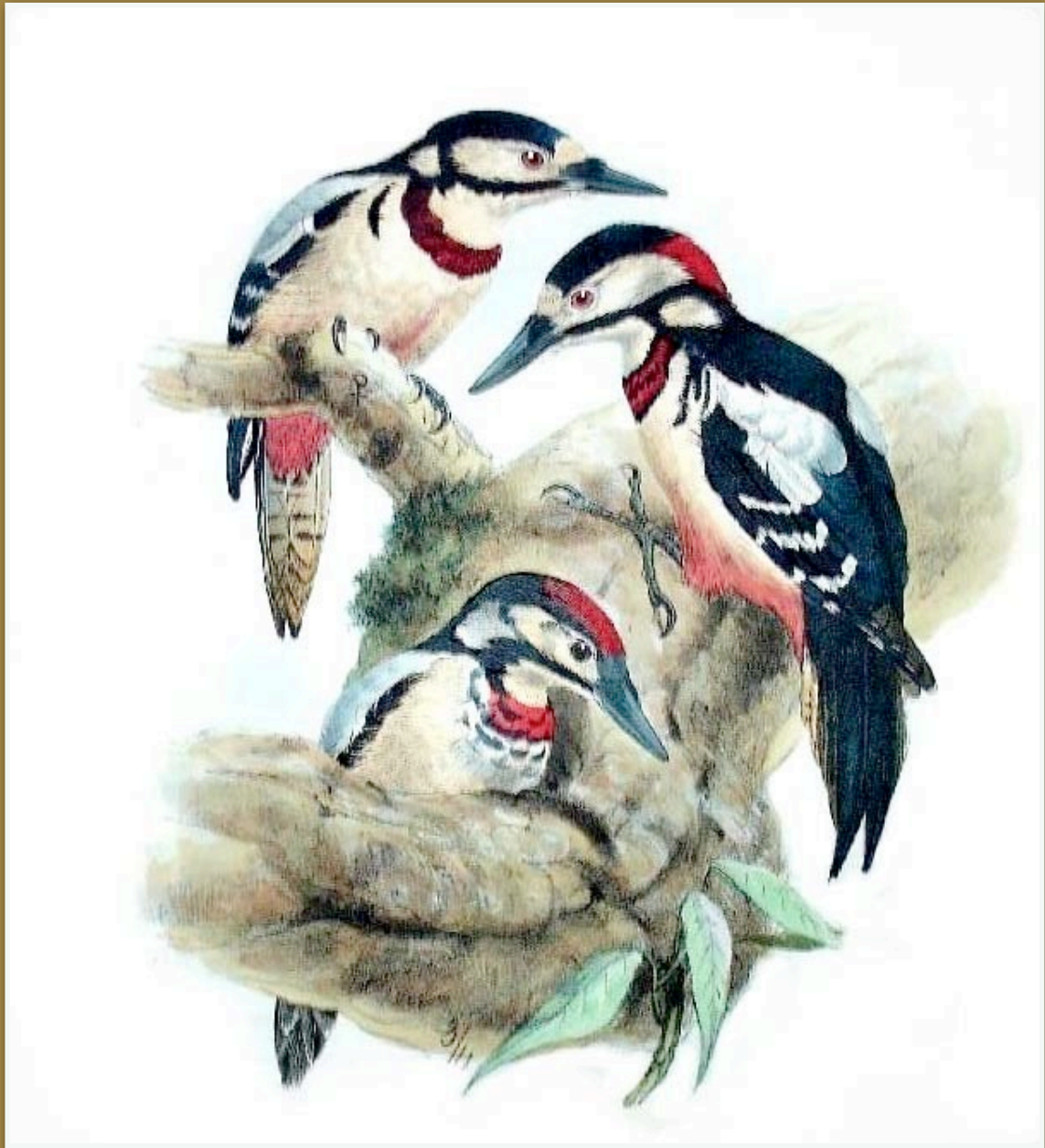

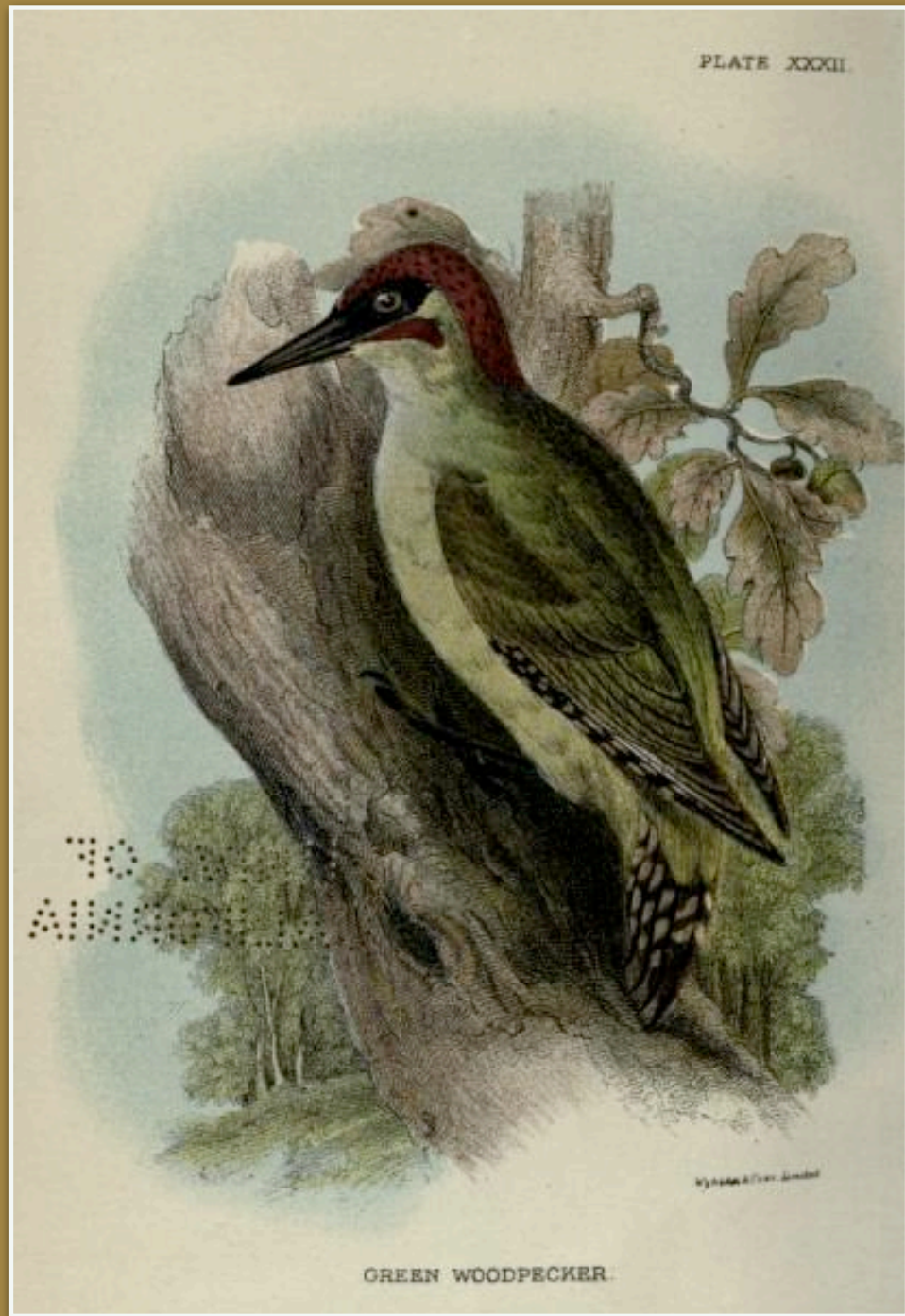

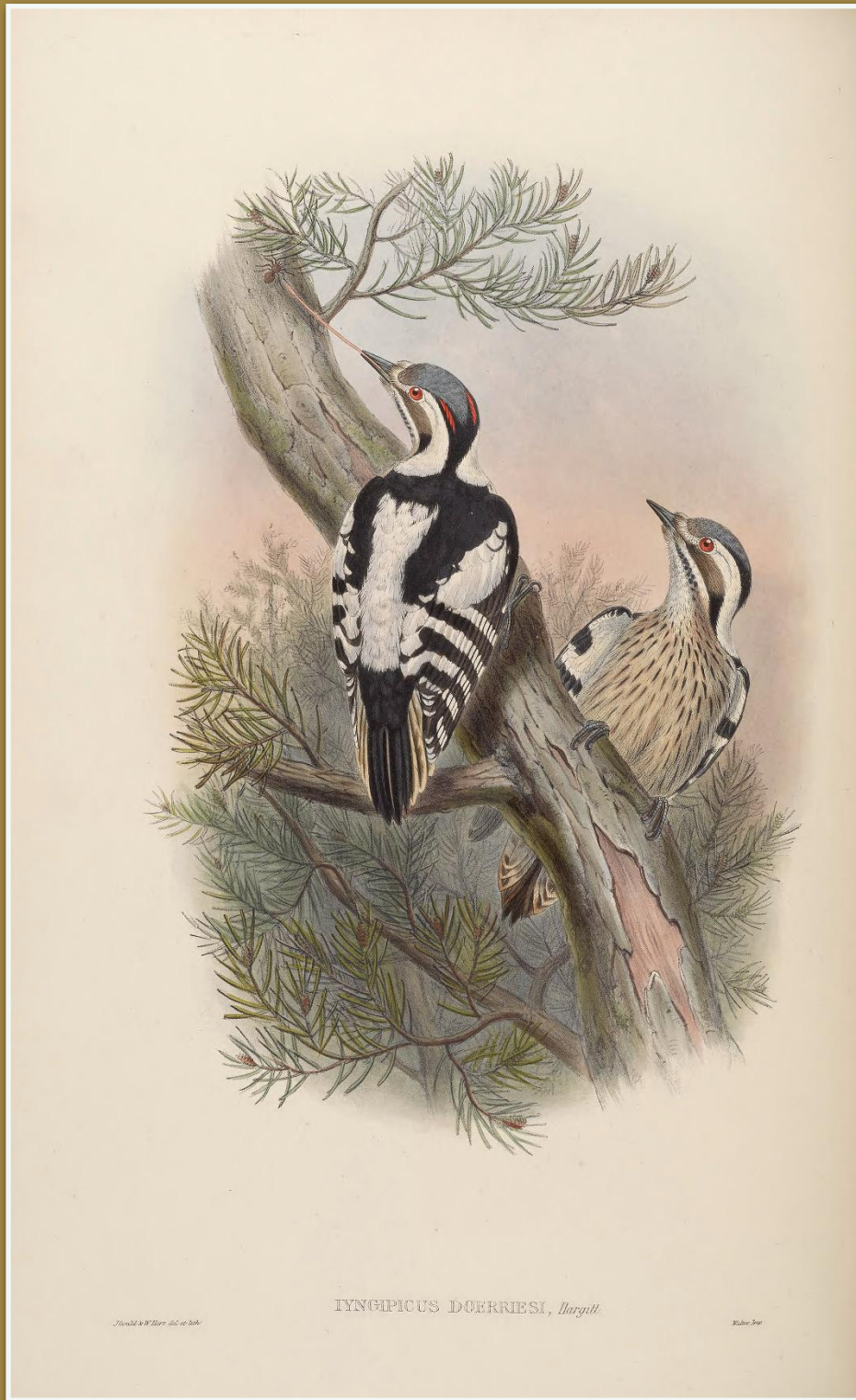

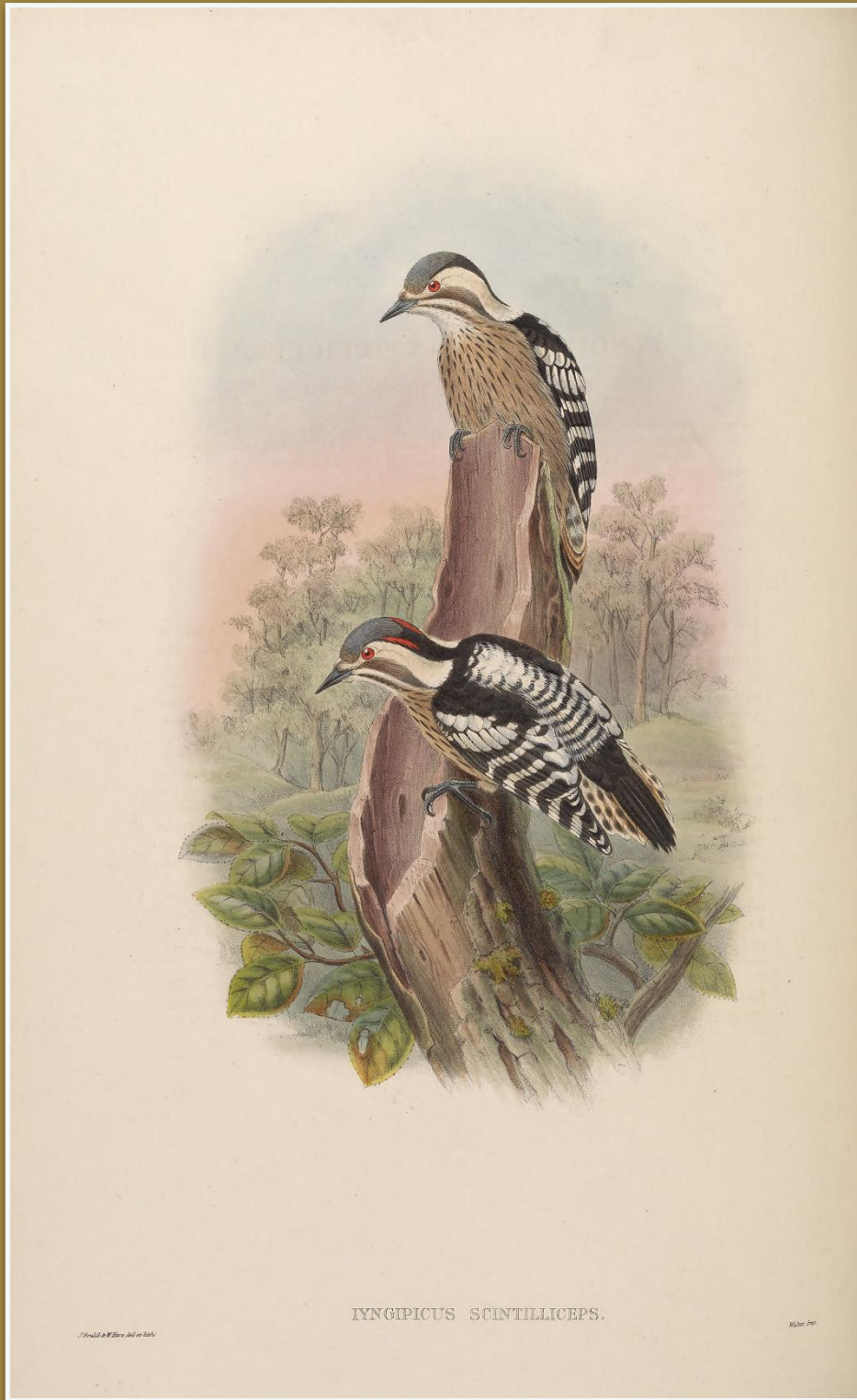

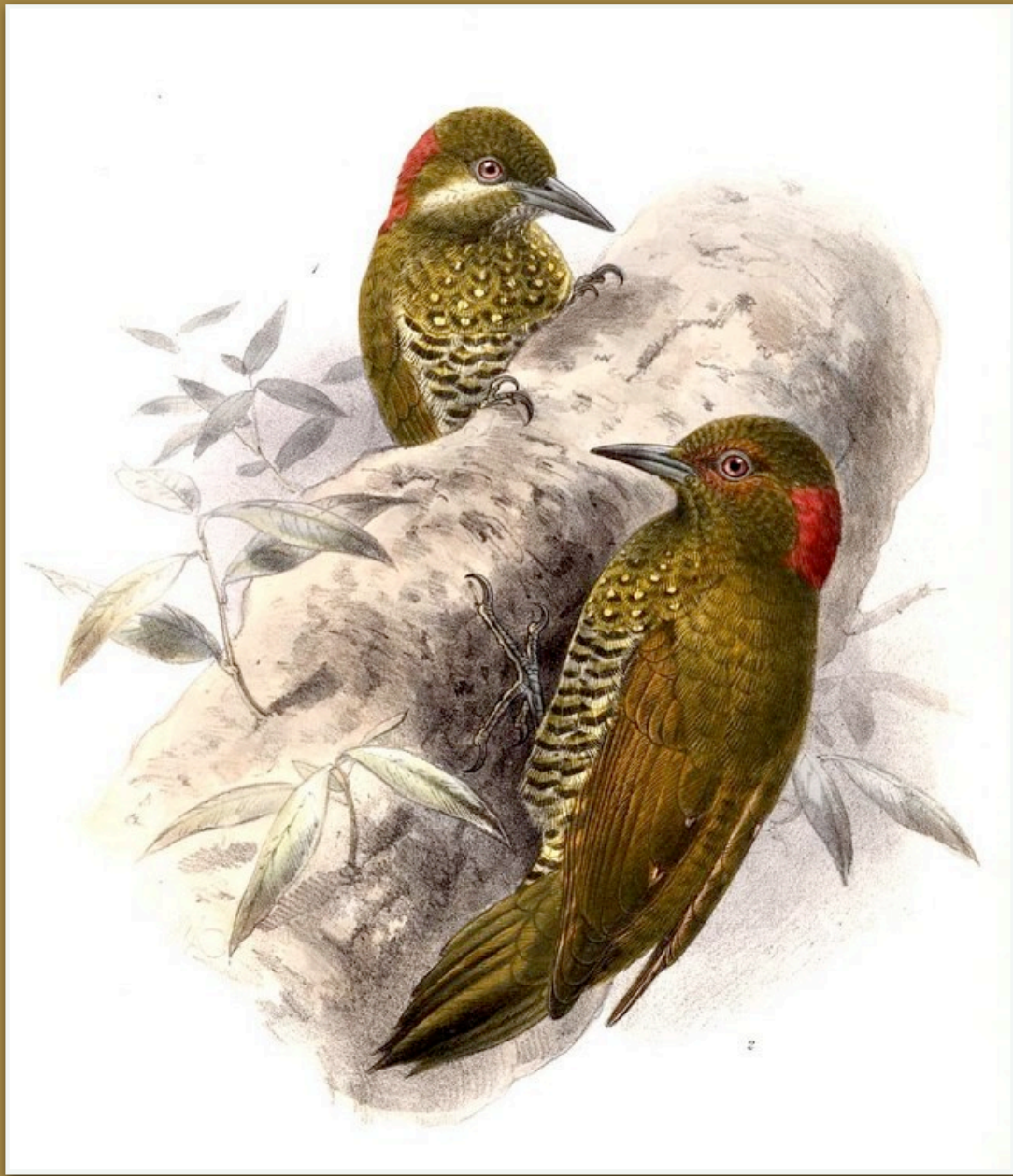

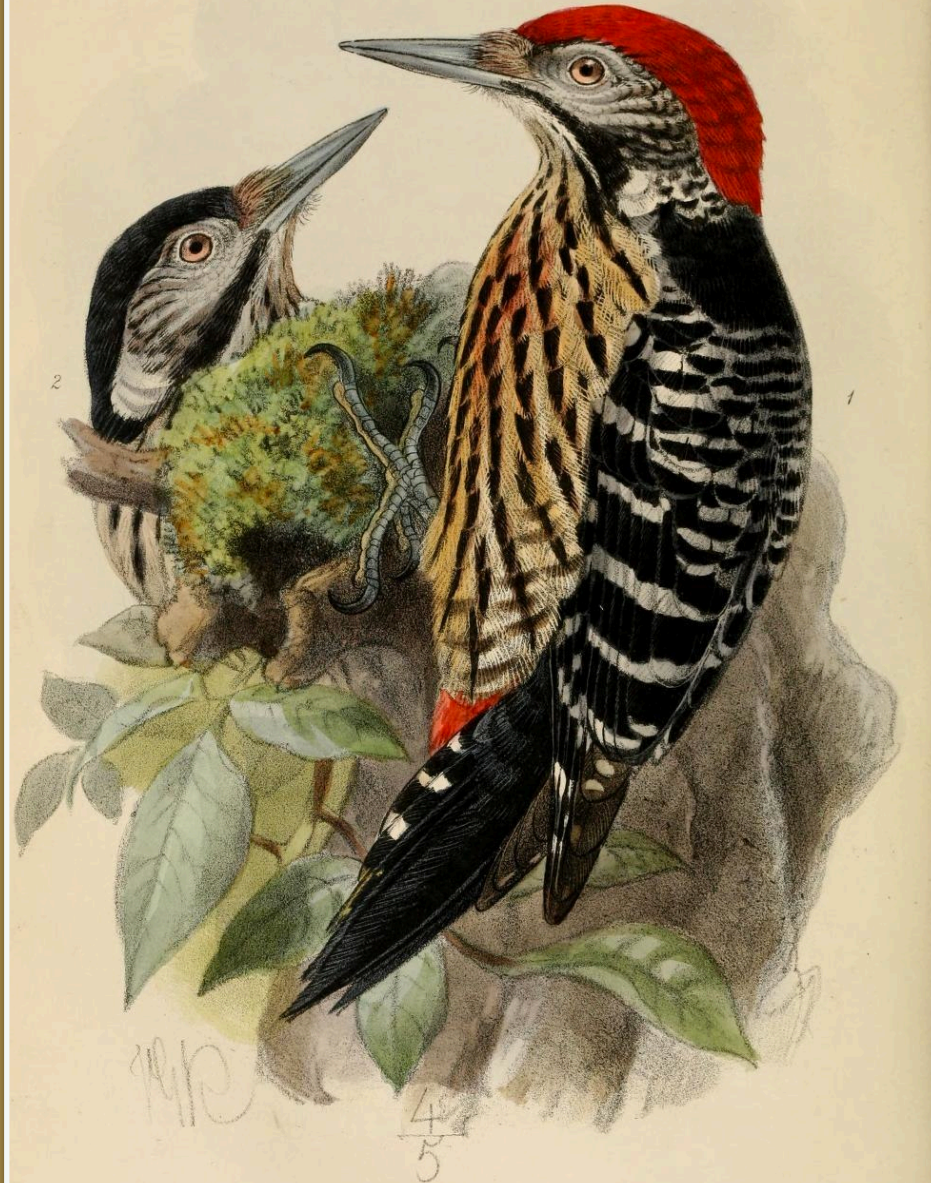

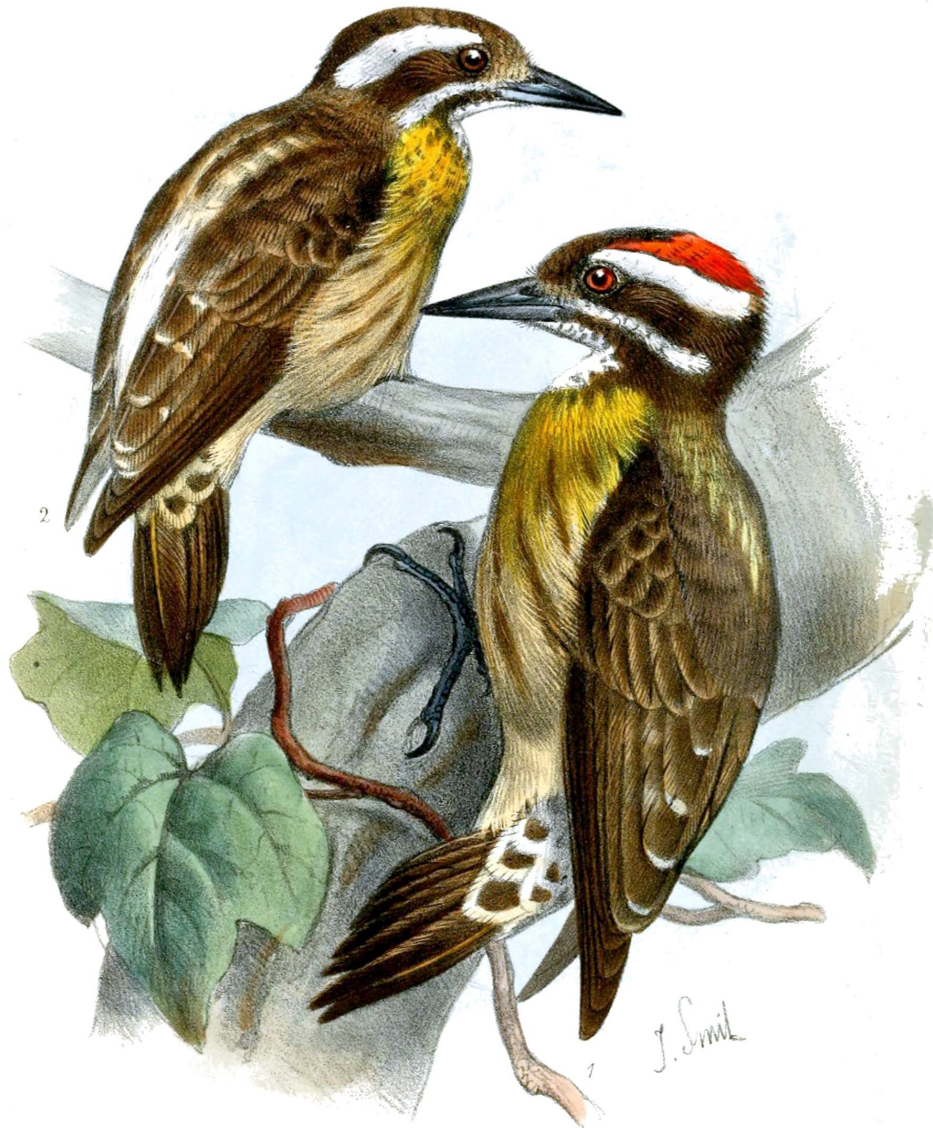

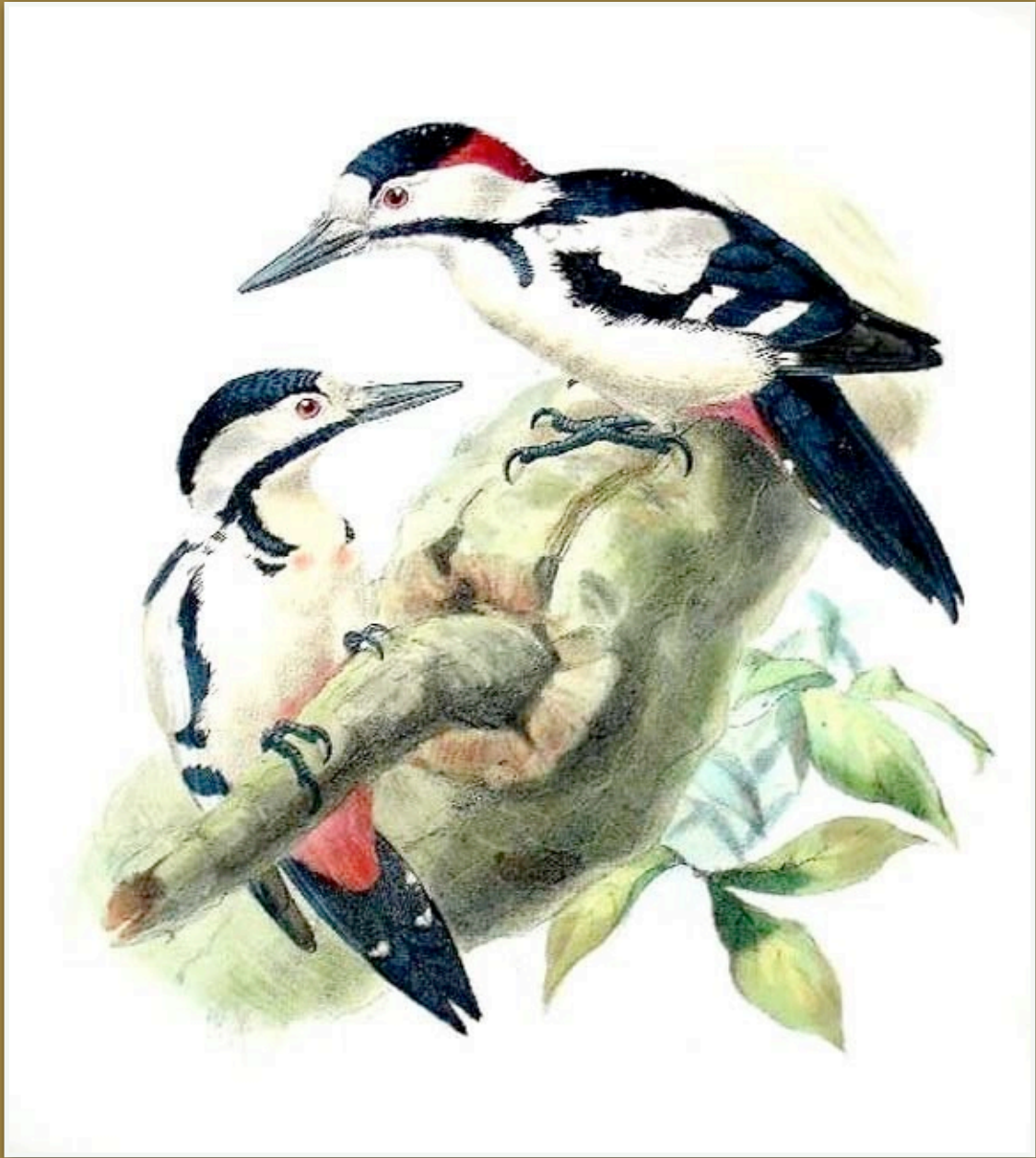

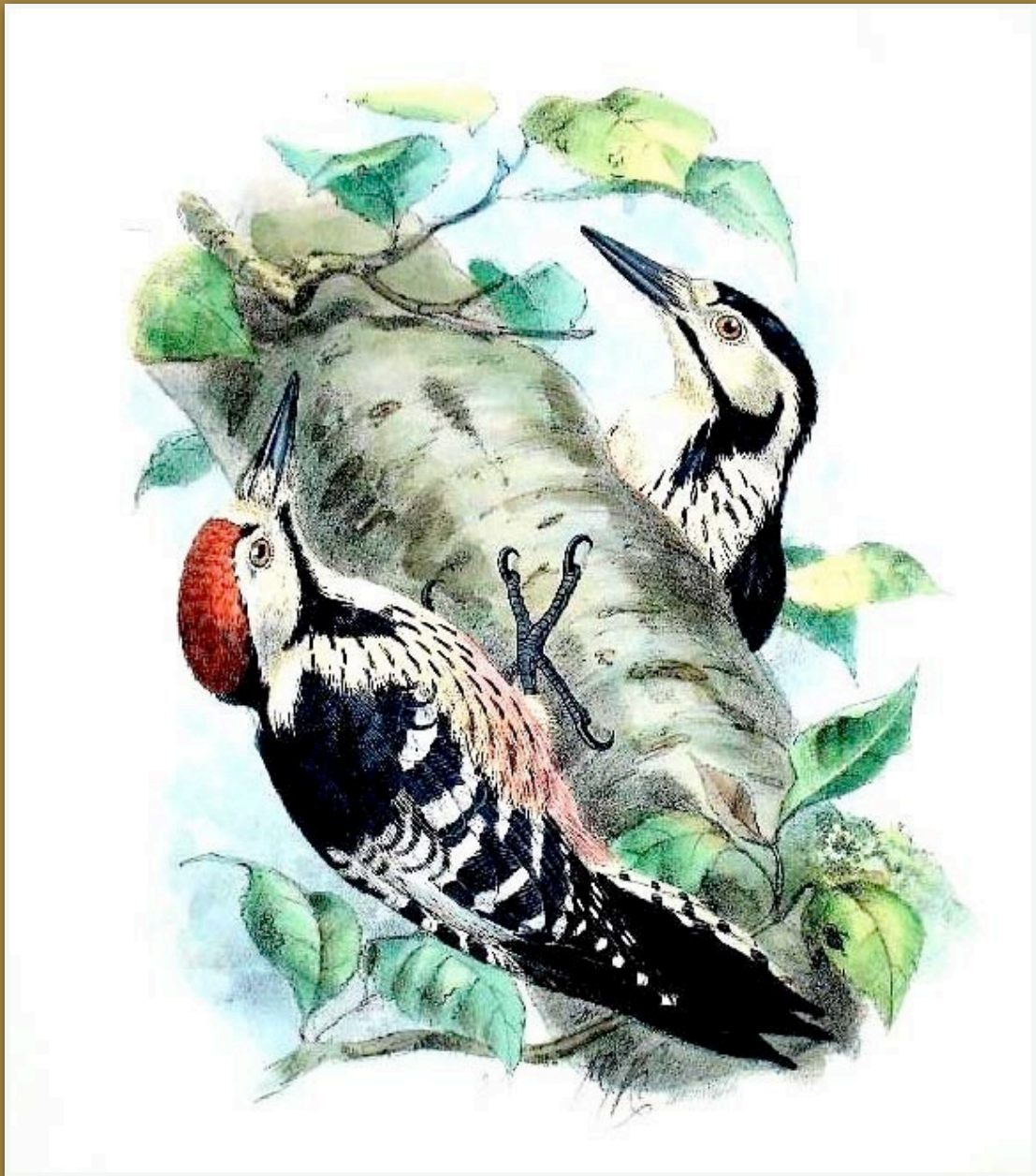

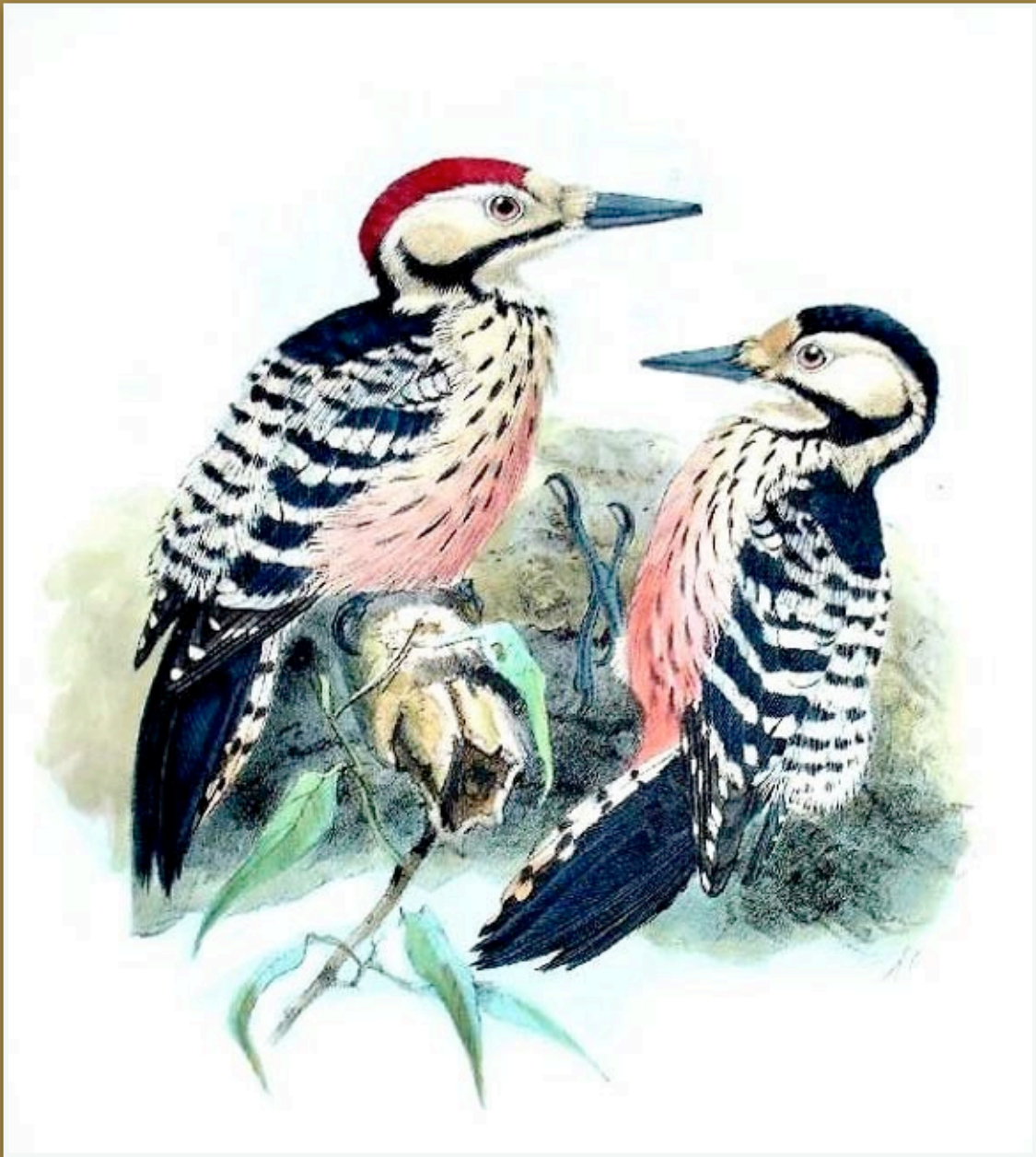

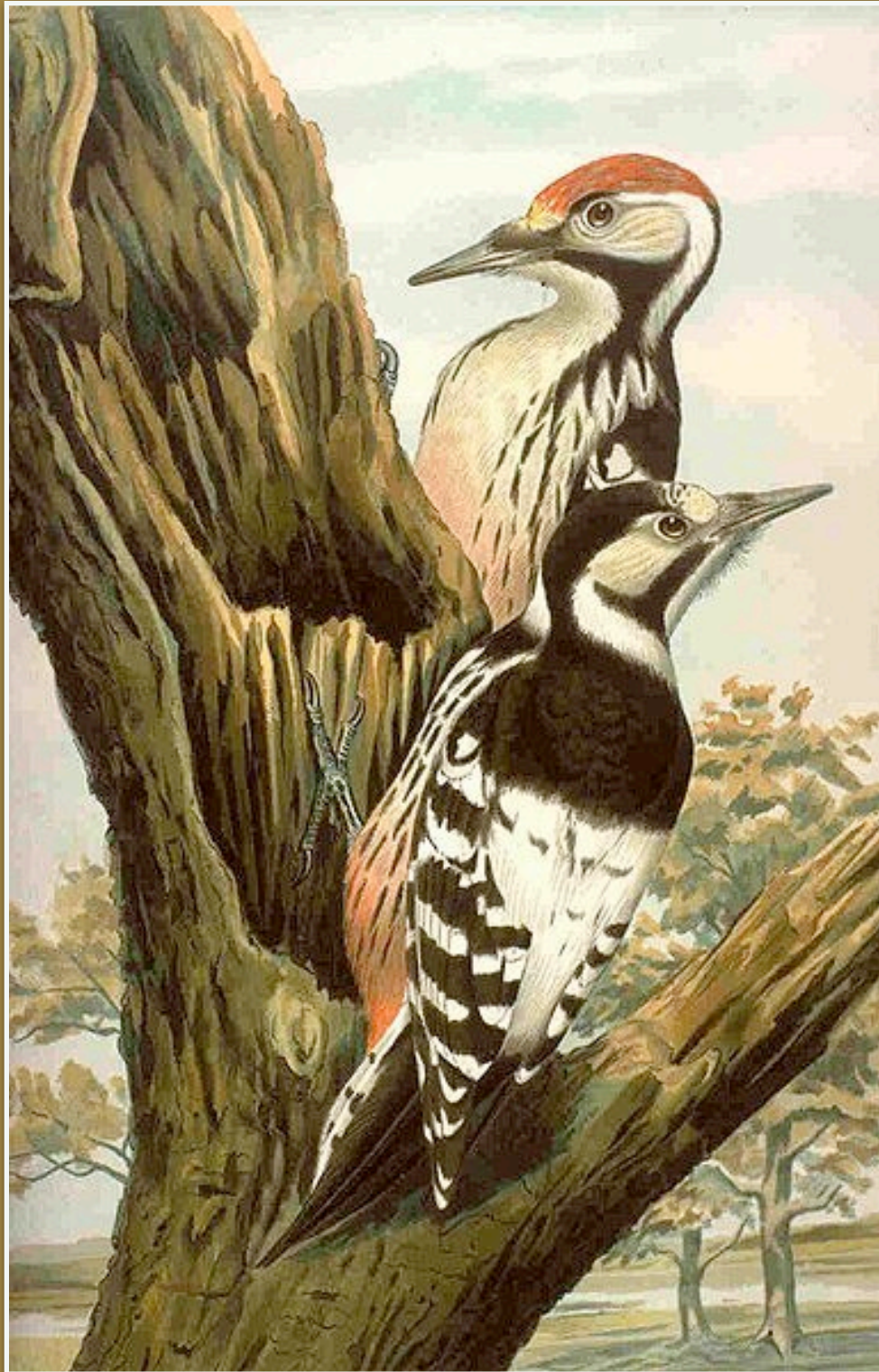

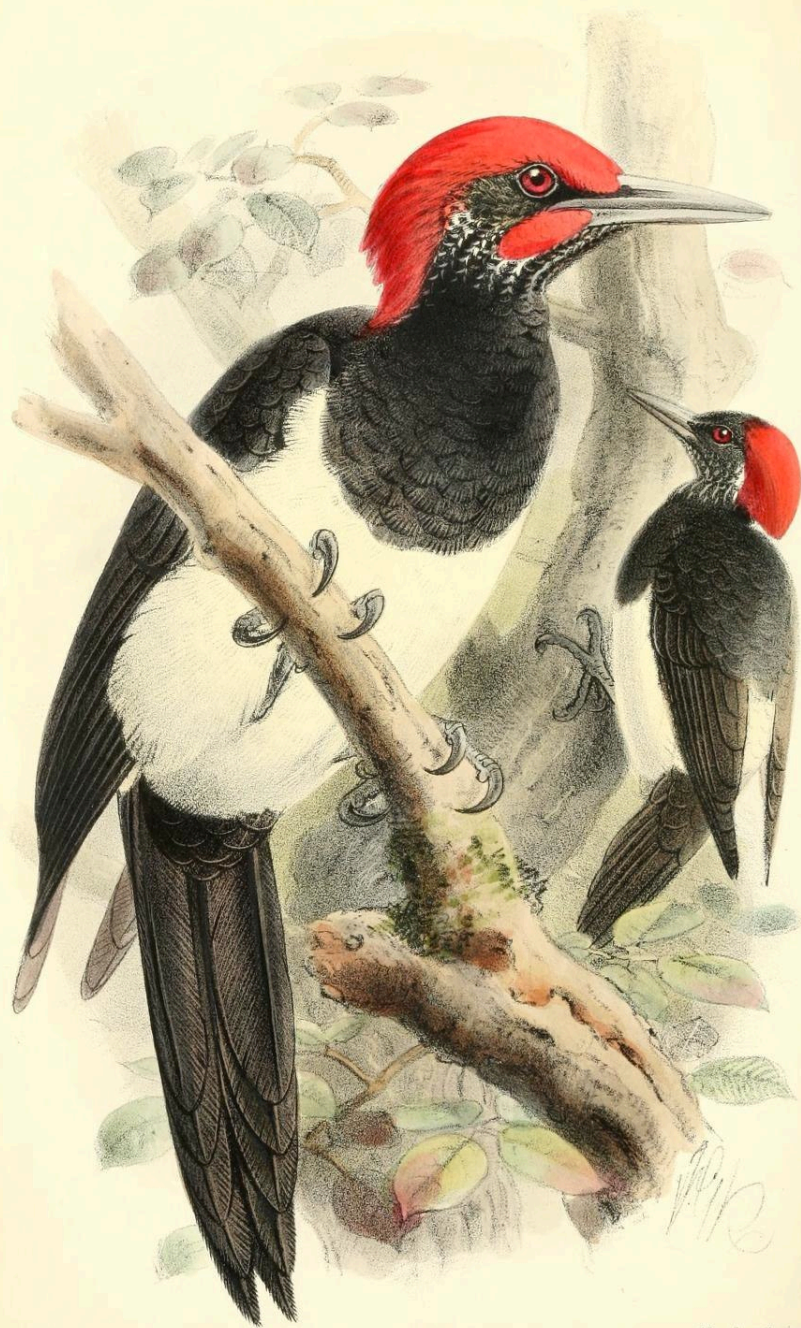

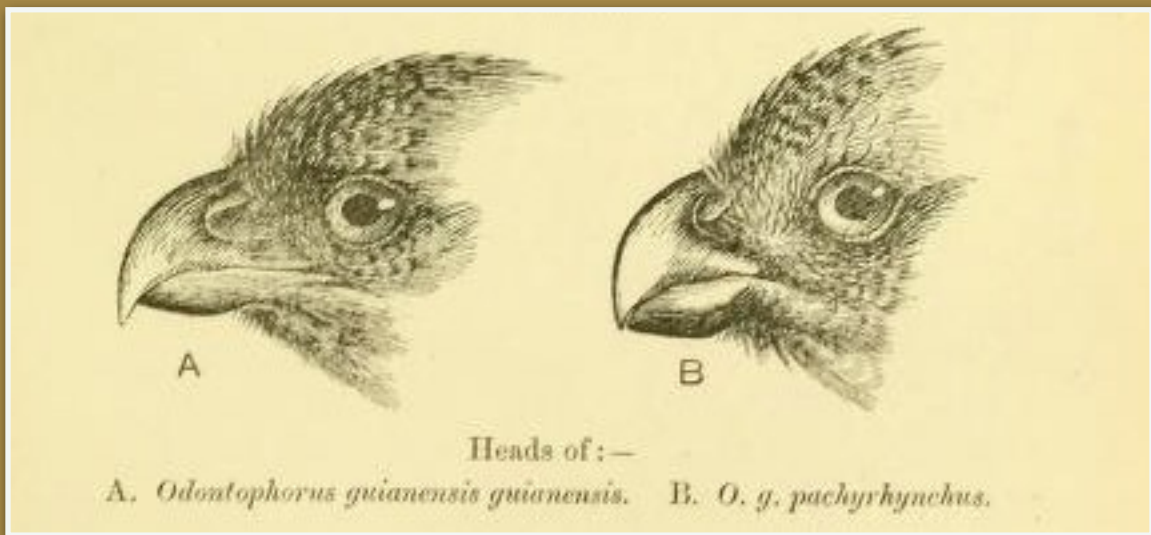

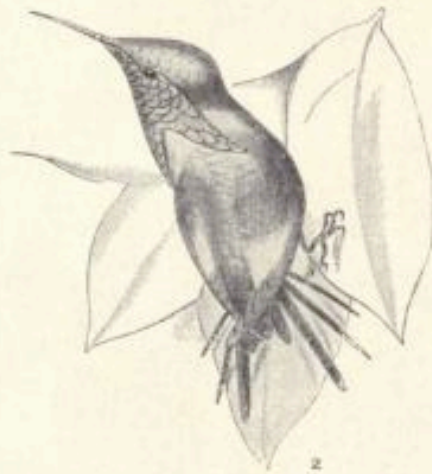


FIG. 1. PUFFED-COQUETTE (*Lophornis magnificus*). (After Gould.)

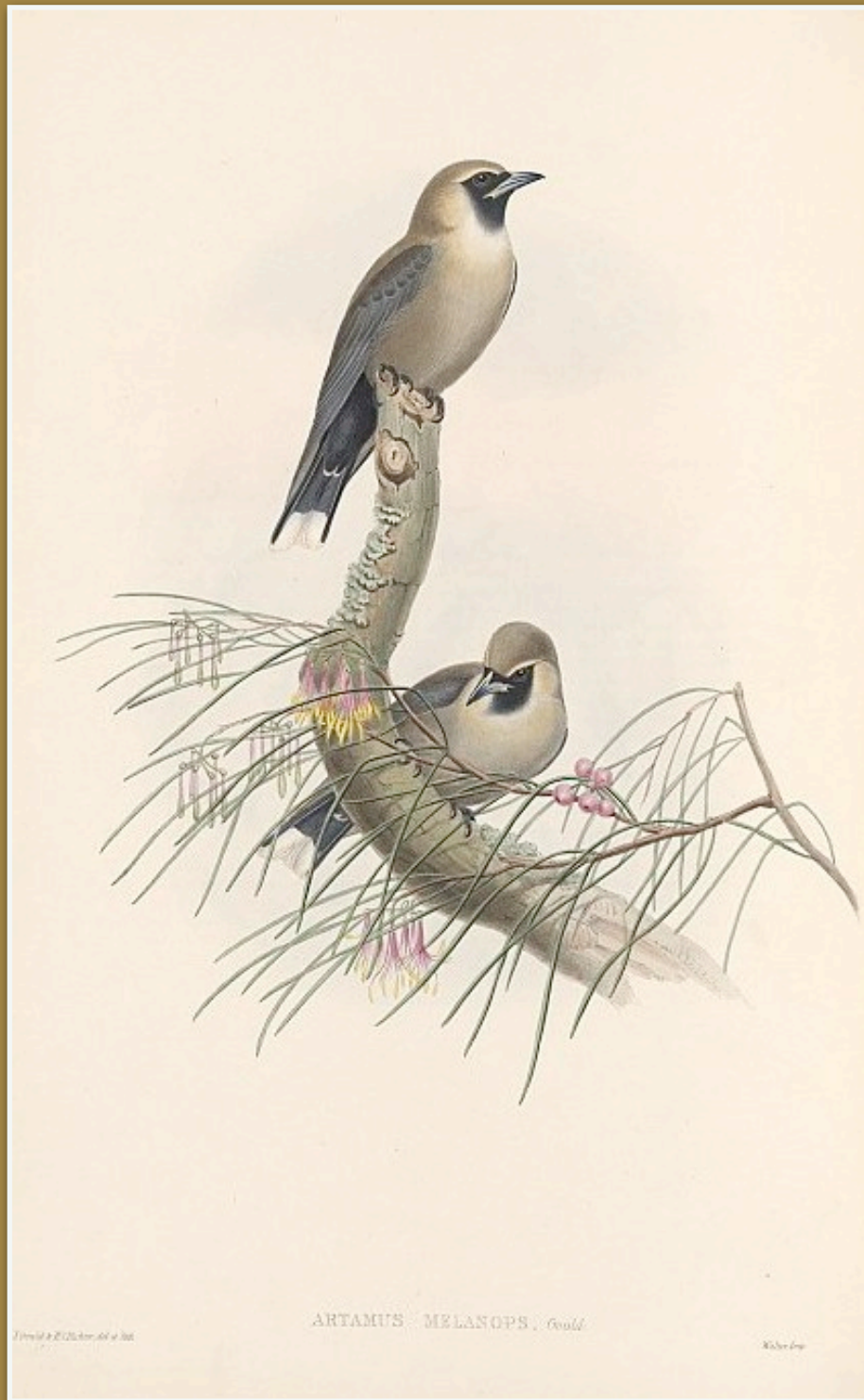

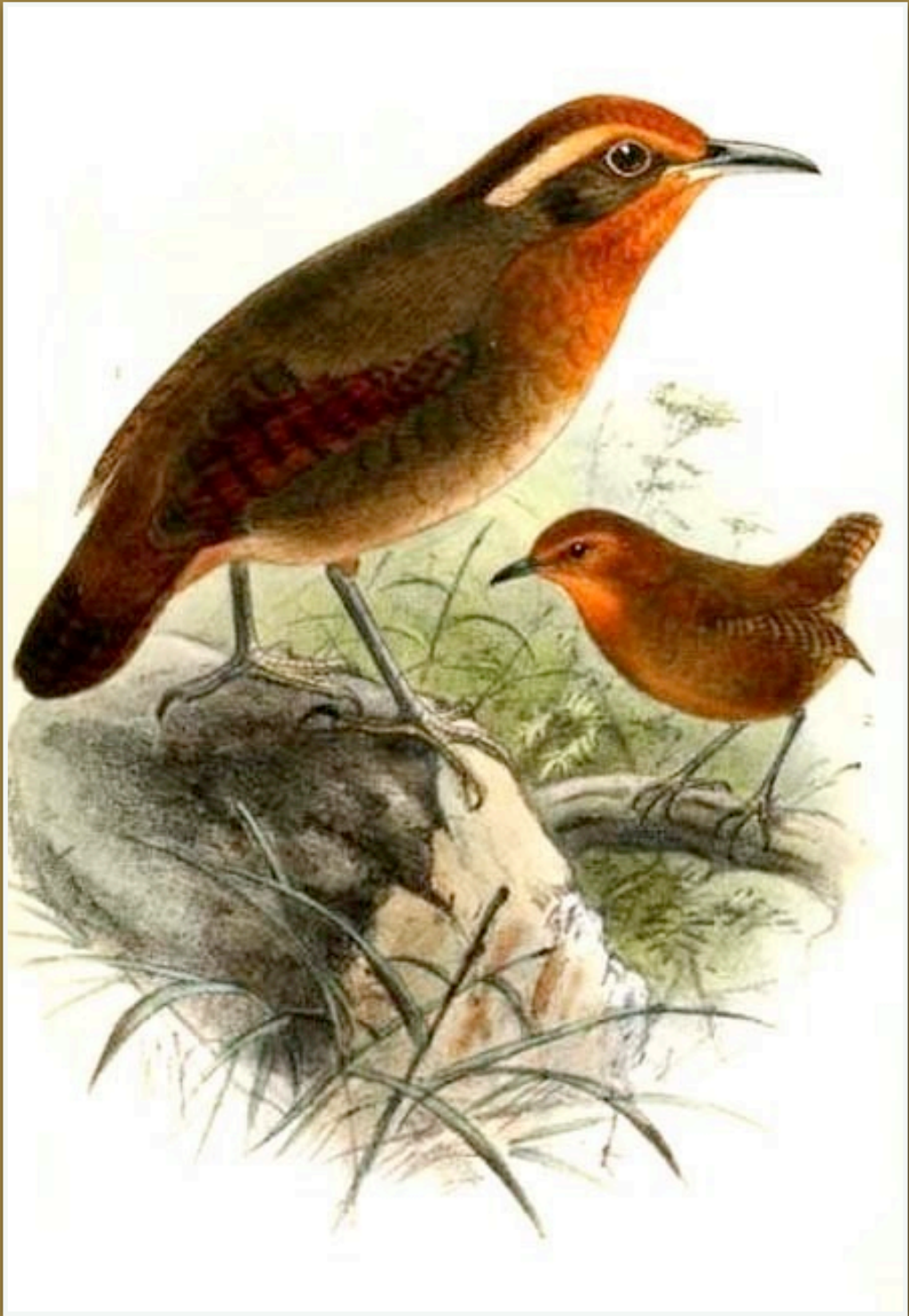

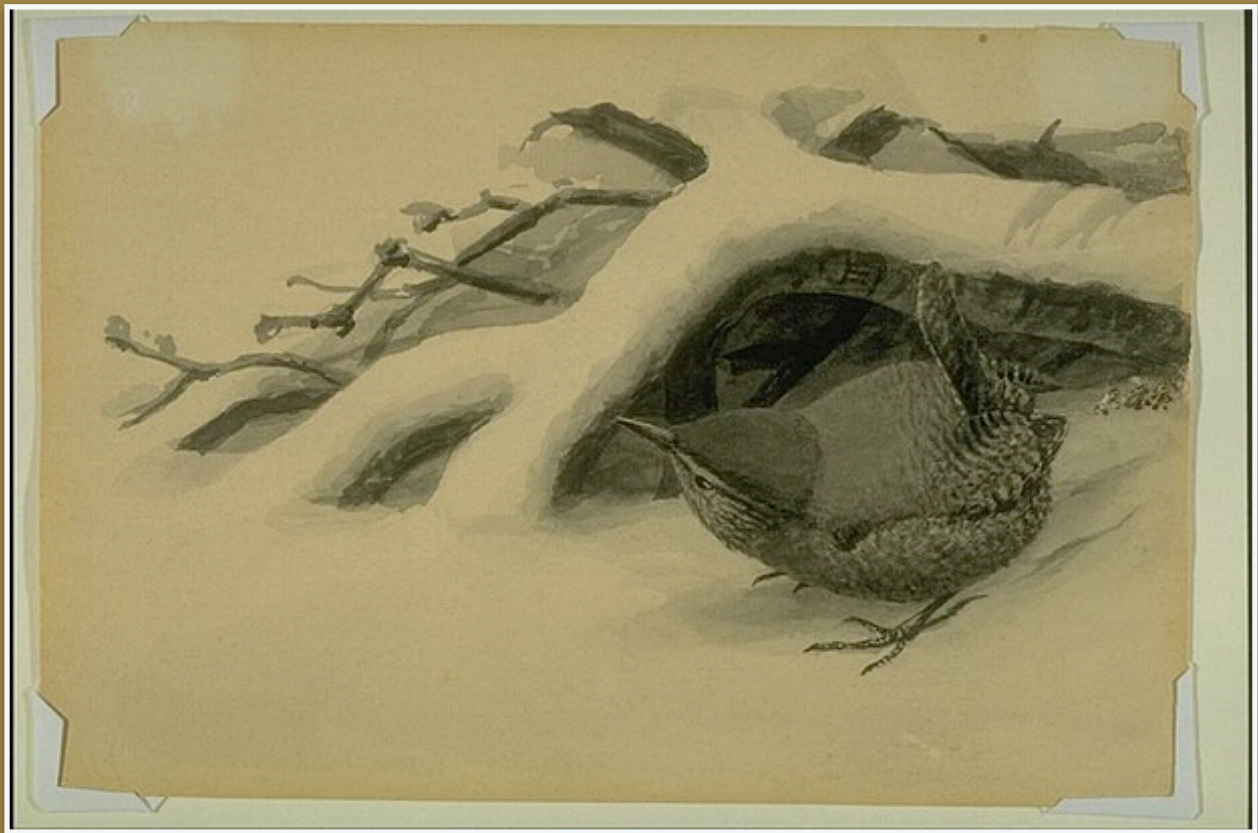

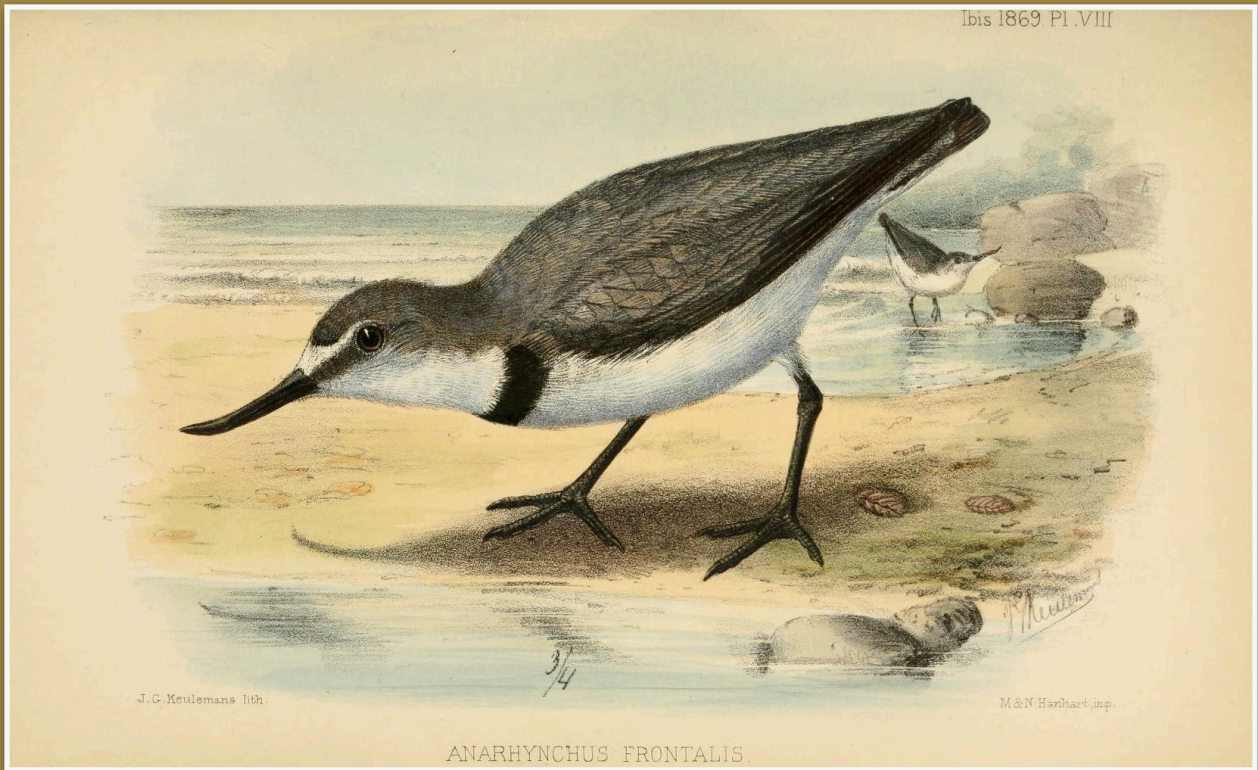

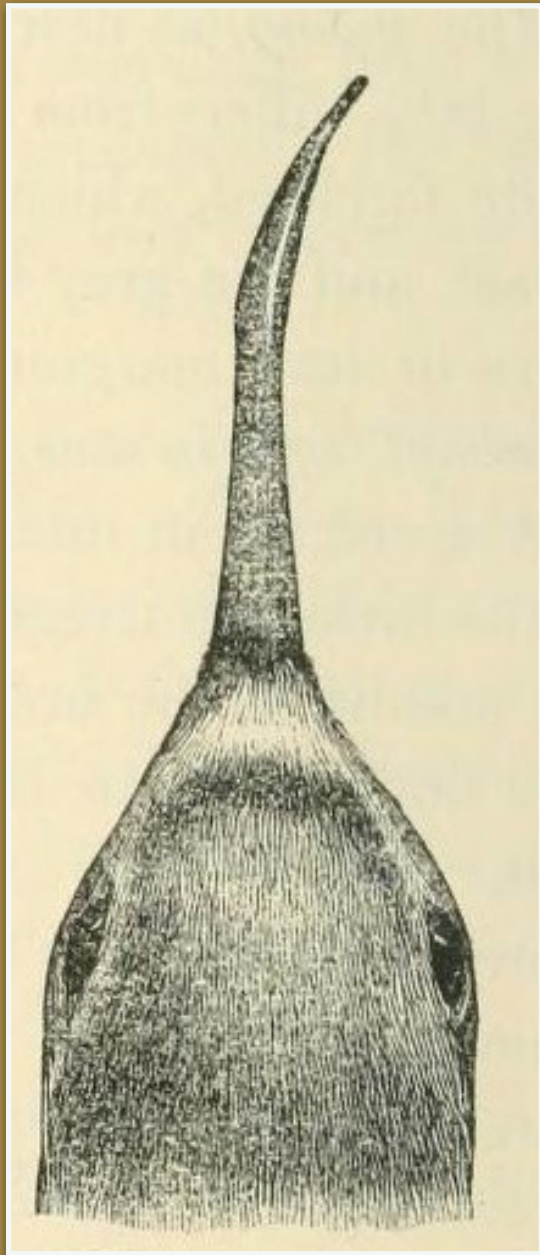

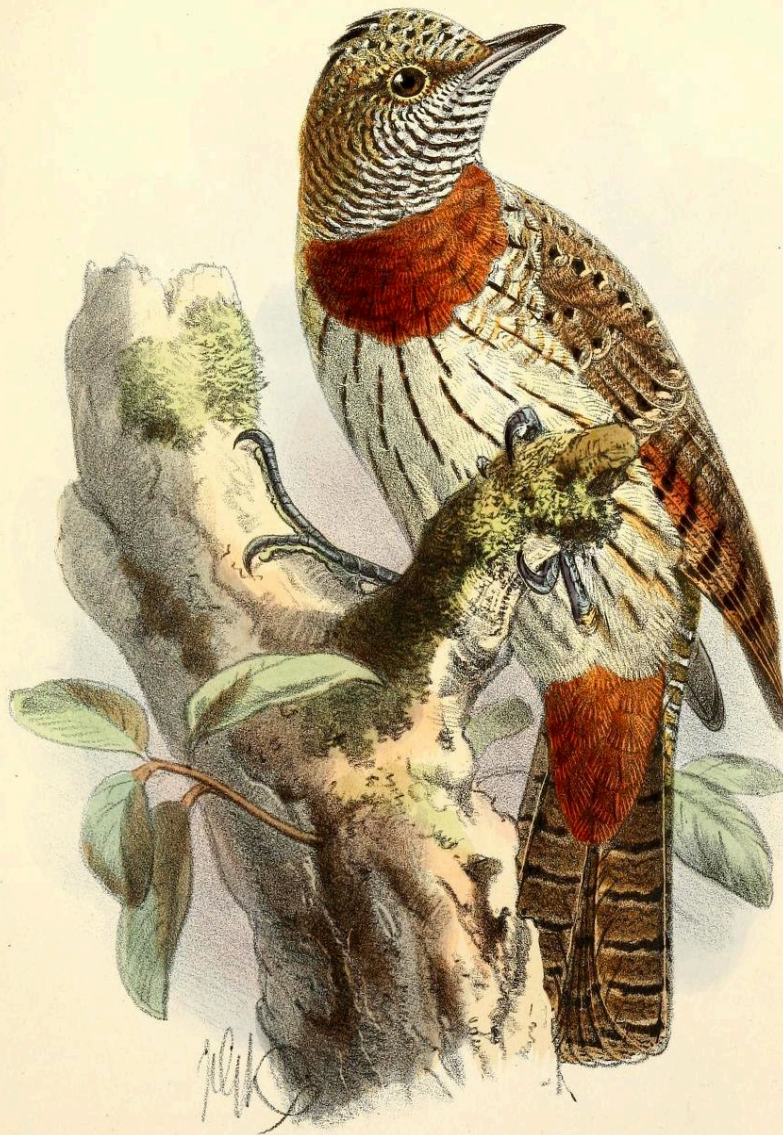
